Native missionaries with AMC are all doing well, as are the Burmese children AMC supports. We hope you enjoy reading these updates. Included you will find a 2023 financial statement.



In October 2023, 5,000 copies of the updated Lisu Bible were printed and boxes upon boxes unloaded at LBI to be distributed amongst Lisu villagers and churches throughout Thailand, Burma, China and India. This new Bible is also being used in LBI classes and during chapel. This is so exciting as this project has taken several years to complete! We are so grateful to those who donated specifically for the printing of this Bible. AMC sent \$8,000 to help with Bible printing costs.

Ahpu taught Doctrine of the Holy Spirit to the 2nd year students, and Old Testament History to the 1st year students during fall 2023. This spring, he taught The Book of Isaiah to 2nd year students, and Old Testament History 2 to 1st year students. During the Thanksgiving season, he took students to various churches to participate in Thanksgiving celebrations. Ahpu and students preached the Word and praised God through musical performances.



LBI recently held a graduation ceremony for 9 students who completed 4 years of class work and 6 months of internship. These students have accomplished a lot and are to be celebrated! The graduation ceremony signaled the end of another school year, and a new school year will begin in June 2024 with 1st, 2nd and 3rd year students. At the end of 2023, Ngwa, Nar Yet and the 9 children moved into a larger home. Their former home was very crowded, and their new home has 3 rooms, as well as a living room and study room. They still experience frequent power outages and have to rely on fires for light/heat. They gather firewood from forests and church youth help them. The children have finished the school year and are currently on summer break. During this break they are studying English for 2-3 hours/day and Ngwa shares that every morning at 6am they do devotions. Some of the children are learning guitar and piano as well. Ngwa has shared with us that the political situation is still not good in Burma, and he asks for prayer over this.



Thank you for your continued prayer and financial support of AMC. Your gifts continue to make a significant impact on the work being done throughout Southeast Asia. We hope that you have been blessed by reading this update. We look forward to seeing what God will continue to do through the missionaries AMC supports.
